Programs At-A-Glance

- CHIME enhances the health and wellbeing for early childhood caregivers. Twelve 8-week CHIME classes sponsored by special grants yielded 98 participants, saving them \$13,230.
- 62 participants attended the Hastings Crop Production Clinics. 72% reported an increase in pest management knowledge that contributed to a \$9.20/acre value of their attendance.
