Programs At-A-Glance

- Farm Safety: 382 youth learned how to be safe in our rural communities in Kearney/Franklin Counties through Farm Safety Programs in collaboration with 4 local FFA Chapters in 2023.
- Early Childhood: Through 39 programs, with over 298 hours, Early Childhood educators reached 679 childcare teachers. Saving teachers \$13,230 in materials and fees.
