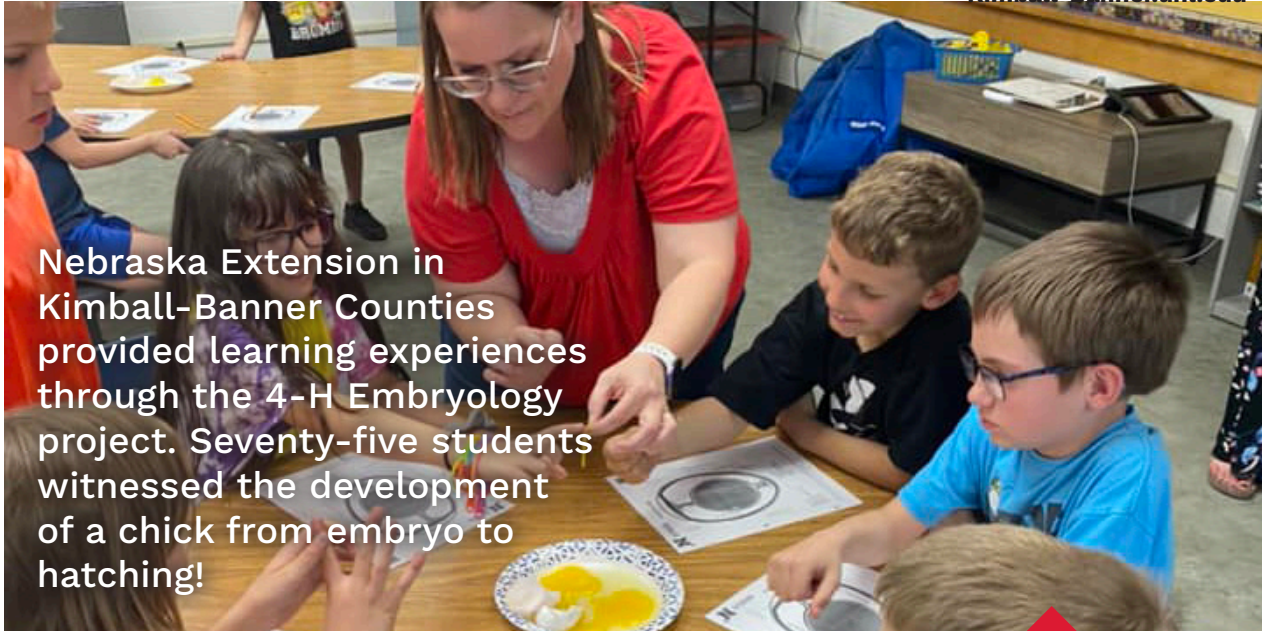


Kimball & Banner Counties Impact At-A-Glance

Nebraska Extension in Kimball-Banner Counties provided learning experiences through the 4-H Embryology project. Seventy-five students witnessed the development of a chick from embryo to hatching!

Over three weeks school students learned about embryology, which included the parts of an egg, how an embryo develops, the incubation process and caring for newly hatched chicks. A second grade student said “It is exciting to learn about chickens, and how they develop in an egg.” A teacher from Banner County School stated the experience helped her better understand the science behind the growth and development of a baby chick. “I never realized there were so many different parts to an egg. It’s fascinating how each part plays a unique role in the development of a live baby chick!”
